Talent Search & Gear-Up

- Over 16 counselors throughout Vermont
- Serves middle and high school students and provides resources, opportunities, knowledge, and financial aid assistance
- First-Generation and low to moderate income focus with some statewide services open to all Vermont students

EOC - Educational Opportunity Center

- 7 counselors serving all of Vermont
- Serves Adults and High School Seniors who do not yet have a 4-year degree
- First-Generation and low to moderate income focus







Money Saving Training Opportunities For High School Students

Early College – VT high school students can apply to one of several VT colleges and, if accepted, enroll full-time in a college program while completing high school requirements – tuition FREE!

Dual Enrollment – All Vermont high school students can take two FREE college classes while in high school earning college credit before graduating.

Career and Tech Ed Certifications – Our CTEs offer VT high school students the chance to earn career-ready certifications as well as college credit.

Pre-Apprenticeship – Offers our high school students a chance to meet some requirements of state approved apprenticeships.





What is Early College Plus?

Students who enroll in CCV's Early College Plus* program:

- ➤ Earn a certificate in one of 5 CCV certificate programs
- ➤ Receive a \$1,000 stipend to help cover the cost of books, fees, transportation or other college costs
- Receive specialized career and education counseling

*Early College Plus is a collaboration between The Vermont Community Foundation, CCV and VSAC. Funding for the stipend is made possible by the VCF.

Apprenticeships in Vermont

Vermont Registered Apprenticeship program

 Assists Vermonters in setting up structured, flexible training programs to meet the specific needs of Vermont employers through on-the-job training and related classroom instruction. There are nearly 700 active apprenticeships in Vermont in over 25 occupations. Employers participate in Registered Apprenticeships by "sponsoring" individuals as apprentices. Vermont Apprenticeships are available through a variety of partners including the Vermont Department of Labor (VDOL), Community College of Vermont and Vermont Technical College.










Stackable Credentials & Career Pathways

There is so much out there!

<u>Vermont WIOA Eligible Training Provider List</u> – The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act program at the Vermont Department of Labor maintains a list of short-term training program that meet basic criteria for quality and outcomes. This list includes information regarding location, cost and associated credentials.

<u>Ed2go</u> - Offers hundreds of online classes, career training programs, and certification prep courses. Trainings are available through the Ed2go site or are also connected through Vermont schools including Vermont Technical College and the Career and Technical Education locations.

<u>Universal Classes through Vermont State Libraries</u> - Vermont Public Libraries provide access to over 500 high quality **free** online courses for all library users. Many can lead to continuing education credits and certifications.

<u>Career Focused Programs</u> – Vermont has many programs focused on specific career training. For example, CDL, Massage Therapy, Building, Computer Professions – too many to list here!





VSAC Financial Aid Resources

Grants & Scholarships

The Vermont Advancement Grant - The Vermont Advancement Grant (*formerly known as the Non-Degree Grant*) is intended to help Vermonters enhance job skills that improve employability or to provide non-traditional students with an introduction to a post-secondary educational program. The maximum award for the 22-23 academic year is \$3000.

The Vermont Grant – For those programs that qualify for Title IV (traditional college funding), a VSAC counselor can assist you in understanding your financial aid options and apply for state and federal grants to help cover the cost of a training program.

VSAC Scholarships – VSAC helps administer over 150 scholarships for Vermonters pursuing non-degree and college opportunities. Learn more at here

The Curtis COV Training Scholarship - Can cover \$500-\$1500 for eligible students. SPECIFICALLY meant for students pursuing certificate programs and credentials of value. Students must work with an EOC counselor to be nominated for this additional funding.

The Adult CTE Scholarship – Provides up to \$1000 for any Vermont adult accessing training through a CTE center
