### How colleges evaluate your scores

- The best single time out
  or
- Super-score method (the best mix on each section)





## Suggested testing timeline

- ACT or SAT in early spring.
- Assess scores over the summer.
- Retake SAT/ACT, if necessary, late spring or fall.





## **Online Testing Rollout**

- SAT to start online testing in March 2024;
- Computer adaptive testing prepare to feel like you're struggling!
- Difficulty adjusts to ability
- Feeling like you're falling behind means you're doing just fine!





### **Guessing strategy**

#### **Guess!**

ACT: Select the letter you feel you've answered least.

All choices are equally represented; therefore, the letter you've chosen the least is likely to appear more frequently in the unanswered questions.

SAT: Computer-based adaptive testing is best-choice-per-question.

#### **Practice tests**

- Understand directions to save time.
- Both test-makers make actual former tests available.
- Most students experience a moderate improvement from 2–3 whole practice tests.





#### Math

- Up through trigonometry for both tests.
- Remainders, odds & evens, exponent rules, prime numbers, roots, one-variable algebra, two-variable algebra, functions, quadratic styles, geometry (memorize formulas for ACT), mean/mode/median, combinations, and permutations.
- SAT includes "free response" math questions.



## **Critical reading**

- Prose fictionCharacters!
- Social science Arguments!
- Humanities Inspiration!
- Natural scienceWhy we were wrong!





#### **Passages**

- Read passage first.
- Write brief notes:
  - 1) Highlight main ideas/topics in each paragraph.
  - 2) Underline key words.
  - 3) Indicate conflict.
- Answer question before looking at answer choices.
- SAT: Double-check "linked questions," where second question depends on answer you got for first question.



## Multiple choice writing

- Most correct.
- Most relevant.
- Most concise.

**TIP: Pick the shortest** grammatically correct answer. The Digital SAT will have "standard English" Qs mixed into the **Reading section** 





#### **Grammar to know**

- Subject-verb agreement
- Pronouns & prepositions
- Punctuation
- Usage (Further or farther? Much or many?)





- Focus on rhetorical analysis.
- Identify figures of speech, "slippery slopes," mistakes/oversights in the argument, and "good points" that persuade the intended audience.
- Eliminated on the Digital SAT





#### **Analyzing what authors do and why**

Your introduction can be very basic; nothing more than:

- In [his/her] essay, [author] [explores/is troubled by/discusses] [the main topic/subject of the essay].
- The main goal of [the author] is to [convince/persuade/ explain to] the reader of [main goal of the author] about [the main topic/subject of the essay.].



#### **Analyzing what authors do and why**

Start your body paragraphs by using the sentence "root" of:

[Author] uses [rhetorical device/technique/structure] in order to have [a specific effect/argue a specific point] on the reader.



#### Analyzing what authors do and why

Other rhetorical devices and persuasive techniques:

- compare/contrast
- metaphor
- repetition

- "slippery slope"
- cause-to-effect
- repetition

. . . and the test does not grade you on how "technical" the persuasive techniques you identify are.

Length: At least 1½ pages; 4–5 paragraphs of 5–6 sentences.



### ACT essay: 6-paragraph format

- Strongly rewards a rebuttal paragraph (second-to-last paragraph).
- 5 goals of education address at least 3.
- Grammar a concern only if systematic or repeated (both ACT/SAT).
- Read once by 2 different readers in 2 minutes.
- Length: at least 2 pages.



#### Science

 Understand and apply the scientific method to various experiments, diagrams, and arguments.

TIP: Use your fingers to "anchor" the chart or experiment you need to review as you come across those in the passage!
