








VSAC-assisted scholarships

- Student will use same MyVSAC account to apply for VT grant, VSAC-administered scholarships, and VSAC student & parent loans, if needed.





VSAC-assisted scholarships

Deadline: February 15, 2023

 Application and ALL supporting materials must be postmarked or uploaded by midnight.

Two-part process:

- Unified Scholarship Application (USA)
- Required documents

FAFSA is required for all scholarships with financial need requirement and must be submitted by deadline.



Additional scholarships through VSAC

Curtis Credential of Value (COV)

Nominated by Educational Opportunity Center counselors

- Students need to meet with EOC counselor.
- Apply for Advancement Grant or VT grant (eligibility for COV not contingent on receiving grants).
