We will continue to serve over 2000 students, 33 schools, students in our GEAR UP After HS program, and 7 statewide partners. Financial Aid, the FAFSA, and other Financing Opportunities

- VSAC and Vermont State University have teamed up to offer Vermonters with a family income of \$65,000 or less the opportunity to attend VTSU tuition free. Funded by the Vermont Legislature, the Freedom and Unity Grant is open to new or returning students of any age who do not already have a bachelor's degree and are enrolled in degree seeking programs at VTSU. Vermont GEAR UP Families

Middle School Parent Tips

- Exploration and "big picture ideas" are the foundation of the OC-student relationship in middle school. Stay on top of opportunities for your middle schooler - encourage participation in field trips, career and college exposure, and social and academic enrichment programs.
- GEAR UP students get the most from our program when they regularly meet with their Outreach Counselor. Encourage connection.
- Ask your student "what would you try if you weren't afraid to make mistakes?" Keep conversations going about what they like, what motivates them, and what supporting them could look like. Ask your OC for a conversation starter deck from GEAR UP!
- Remember middle school is full of social and academic challenges that are much more intense than they are later in life.

11th Grade Parent Tips

- Some say this is the hardest year academically for students. The pressure is on but so is growing independence. Talk with your student, stay the course, how can you be supportive and what do they need from you? What steps need to be taken now for readiness later? Your OC can help and they love to connect with families!
- To connect with your student's Outreach Counselor (OC) ask your student, contact your school, or use the information above (page one left side) where the names of the OCs can be found. Ask about college courses while in high school!!!
- Ask your student "what traits make a good supervisor or boss?" Keep conversations going about what skills they have, what jobs are they curious about, and what supporting them could look like. Ask your OC for a conversation starter deck from GEAR UP!





9th/10th Grade Parent Tips

- These are great years for **testing out interests** and **making a 4 year high school plan**. Look at options with your student on what could enhance learning and exploring opportunities!
- There's never a bad time to make a good first impression! Talk with your student about staying organized (or getting organized), making and keeping supportive relationships, and putting in the work!
- Ask your student "how do you prioritize your spending?" Keep conversations going about what jobs are available to them in their community, and what supporting them could look like. Ask your OC for a conversation starter deck!
- Work-based learning opportunities could be possible through school programs - check out what is offered! These provide great practice and exposure to a variety of careers!
