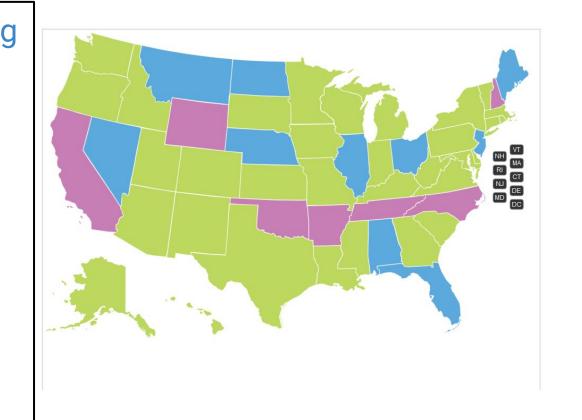

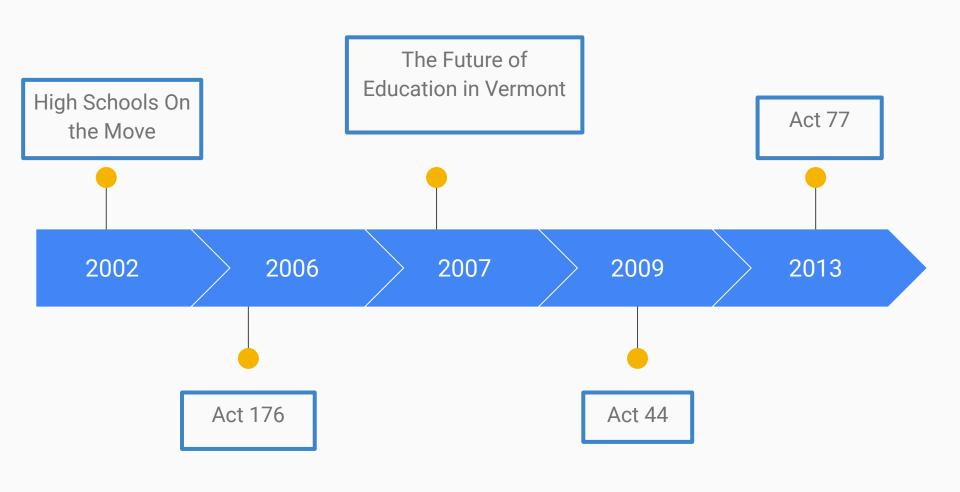

The Heart of the PLP

Student learning plans are student-driven planning and monitoring tools that provide opportunities to:

identify postsecondary goals, explore college and career options, and develop the skills necessary to be autonomous, self-regulated learners.

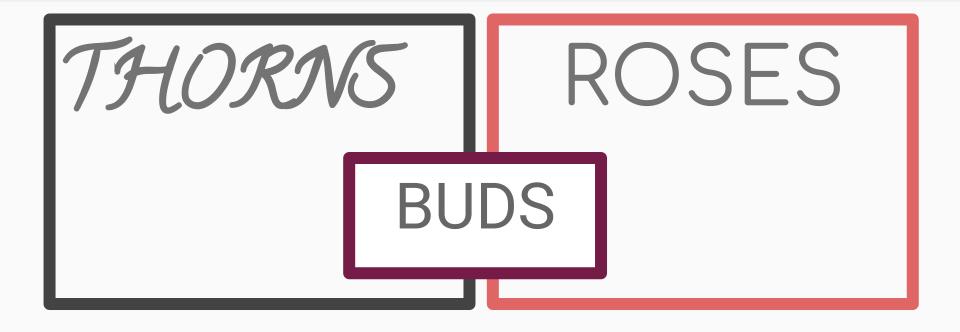

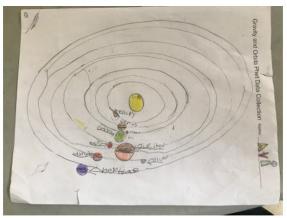
I learned that people act different when we are in different places and environments. Its called code switching.

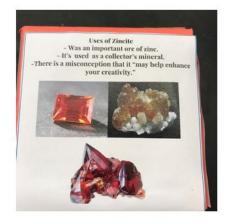

Mineral Box Project

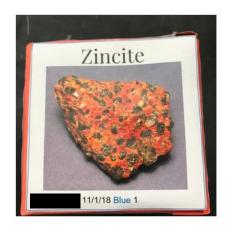

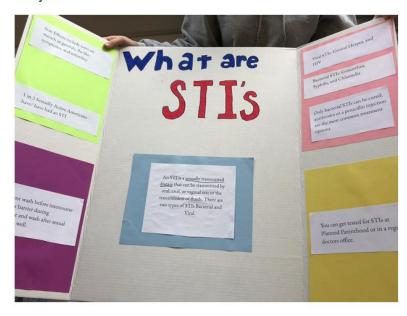

INTRODUCTION

What do I add in the Graduation Expectation (GX) Pages?

Student learning is captured in the Graduation Expectation Pages. Learning can happen anywhere. Students should consider their classes as a primary source of evidence, but students should also consider after school activities, athletics, community service, programs, internships, etc. for material to include in the Graduation Expectations Pages. There are five Graduate Expectations and ideally a student has 2-3 examples of learning in each area for each grade: 9th, 10th, and 11th grade.

Remember 4 things are required when adding evidence:

- The Product (doc, video, picture, presentation) Double check share settings anyone with the link can view
- Name/Title
- Date
- Reflection
